<p>Draw</p>	<p>workspace setup safety issues vocabulary marker care and feeding (click it home, lids up) pencil differences and uses paper variations patterns icons and symbols artist's signature artist's statement light sources, shadows sketching techniques (light touch, feather strokes, erasures) drawing from realia seeing with "artist's eyes" crayon batik layering and distance outlining with markers or ink one point perspective two point perspective native art patterns and design blending crayons, pencils, colored pencils, markers melted crayon technique: safety (heat), crayon usage, peeling crayon pastel technique: blending, safety (clothing) cleanup standards recycling of used materials – mistakes in folders for later use</p>
<p>Paint</p>	<p>workspace setup safety issues (water on floor, paint on clothing, care of aprons, use of clean rags, wet painting storage, no splatter painting) vocabulary brush care and use paint care and use watercolor tempera wet on dry wet on wet color mixing and color wheel primary colors secondary colors tertiary colors watercolor techniques: bleeds, light+dry --> darker+dry → outline non-objective vs reality crayon resist</p>

Print	<p>workspace setup safety issues stamp techniques and care handmade stamps from Styrofoam, soft core, and vegetables symmetry/asymmetry balance dominance rhythm/movement pattern color palette (warm and cool) monoprint (negative space via stamp lift-off) monoprint (designs in rolled ink) collagraph vocabulary cleanup standards recycling of used materials – mistakes in folders for later use</p>
3D	<p>workspace setup safety issues attachment demos: L brace, slot brace, wedges, flanges, brads, glue, tape, pipe cleaners, string balance properties of materials (hard vs soft, plastic vs paper, cardboard strength) shake test size guidelines via polka-dot box material limitations vocabulary cleanup standards recycling of used materials – mistakes in folders for later use</p>
